PROF. KAIKHOSROV D IRANI HONORED ON HIS 90TH BIRTHDAY

Professor Irani Honored on His 90th Birthday for a Remarkable 61-Year Academic Career

On June 13th, 2012 Professor, Kaikhosrov Dinshah Irani, was honored at his 90th Birthday by the City College of New York (CCNY) with a Faculty Service Award for his incredible career spanning six decades and for touching and inspiring generations of students during that time. Our ZAGNY members were there to proudly celebrate this jubilant, milestone event with him.

CCNY President, Lisa Coico, felicitated Prof. Irani with this honor and spoke glowingly about his distinguished career as a philosopher, scholar, chair, teacher and mentor. She spoke about KD, as he is often referred to and fondly recalled by his colleagues and multitudes of grateful alumni, and how he has been a source of continuous cultural and intellectual enrichment and encouragement, not only for students of philosophy, but for all students, college and university-wide, who have enjoyed the privilege of interacting with him. She mentioned that KD's interests are as diverse as their student body--on one hand he is an expert on ancient civilizations and religions (especially Zoroastrianism); on the other, adept on philosophical issues in modern physics, which led him to work with Einstein.

Often in the City University of New York (CUNY) circle, upon knowing that this author is a Zoroastrian she has been told, then you must know KD! Many of CCNY's distinguished alumni, who have gone on to achieve great success and to make important contributions of their own, remember KD especially well and fondly. Observations he made to them, or particular lessons he taught them, have remained with them for life. One of his prodigious alumni, an anonymous Scandinavian who became a successful chemical engineer, had credited KD's influence as essential to his own achievements, and had bequeathed two million dollars for The Irani Fellowship in 1999. This fellowship continues to enrich the lives of CCNY students via contact with distinguished visiting philosophers.

Kaikhosrov Dinshah Irani was born on May 1, 1922 in Mumbai, India. In 1947 he moved to USA to continue his studies in Physics at Princeton University, where he was taught by Albert Einstein. It was Einstein's letter of recommendation that led him to get appointed at CCNY in 1950. KD has consistently manifested all the intellectual and humanistic qualities that Einstein undoubtedly prized him with, and which KD in turn has stimulated in so many generations of CCNY students and alumni. He taught philosophy at CCNY for the following 41 years and has been Professor Emeritus ever since. Prof. Irani just completed his final class at CCNY this spring 2012. The Faculty Service Award from the Alumni Association was a fitting close to his historic career.

9/11 UNITY WALK BY: HOMI D GANDHI

The 9/11 Unity Walk in New York City on Sunday, September 9th, 2012 was co-sponsored by Religions for Peace USA and the Interfaith Center of New York.

Unity Walks have been held for many years in Washington D.C., New York City, and other U.S. communities. The 2012 NYC 9/11 Unity Walk began at 3pm in Washington Square Park, with opening remarks from Rev. Bud Heckman, Executive Director of Religions for Peace-USA and Intersections Executive Director Rev. Bob Chase. The walk visited religious communities along its path, (Judson Memorial Church and Hindu Temple on Broome Street) where different faith leaders reflected and offered prayers. The group also stopped at Synagogue for the Arts, a unique architecture in the midst of attached houses and shops, before concluding the walk at 5pm at St. Peter's Roman Catholic Church at 22 Barclay St., adjoining the World Trade Center site.

The Ribbons of Hope art installation, created on last year's 10th anniversary of 9/11, was displayed at St. Peter's. There were reflections and prayers from Christian, Islamic, Zoroastrian, and Buddhist faiths at the Church. After the prayers, the audience was invited to take a ribbon, write a commitment that will continue this sense of Unity, and then pin it on the banners of the Ribbons of Hope art installation.

Collective, collaborative action between people of diverse faiths is one of the strongest avenues for humans to reflect and be reminded of our common commitments and responsibilities. Recent tragic events in Wisconsin, Missouri, and Colorado perpetuate a narrative of violence and division and remind us of the urgency of our action. With the anniversary of 9/11, we had a unique opportunity to remind ourselves and educate future generations about our shared values as people of faith and goodwill.

NEED A KIDNEY DONOR



Sameera (Sam), seen here with her 6-month old daughter Simran, was diagnosed with Renal Failure in 2005.

She was put on the Deceased Donor List at the beginning of 2008 once she hit End-Stage Renal Disease (ERD). Her younger sister, Nicole (Nikki), was a perfect match and a transplant was completed in lune 2008.

In July 2009 Sam's body started rejecting the kidney and this was controlled by medication.


In March 2012, Sam went through a second rejection, followed by a third rejection that led to renal failure in August 2012. She was immediately put on dialysis.

The process for putting her on the Deceased Donor List again has started. The expected wait time is more than 8 years.

Living donors provide the best chances for a successful transplant and post transplant quality of life.

A donor for Sam must have blood group O+ and will have to undergo further type matching tests and procedures before being confirmed as a donor.

Since all this takes time, the earlier potential donors are identified the better.
